House 39B Lane 1135, House # 1856	Historical Building. The property belongs to Sheikh Salman bin Ali bin Khalifa Al Khalifa, the son of Sheikh Ali bin Khalifa, who built the house. On the NE corner of the property, the Sheikh's daughter lived, who was one of the wives of Sheikh Abdullah (the son of the ruler).	Architectural Heritage
House 39C Lane 1135, House # 1855	Residential Building. Owned by Sheikh Fahad bin Ahmed bin Rashid.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 39D Lane 1138, House # 2060	Residential Building. Owned by Sa'ad bin Juma'ah. His father Juma'ah was the <i>nukhidhah</i> of a fishing boat.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 39E Lane 1138, House # 2063	Residential Building. Owned by Ya'qoub al-Hamer, a fisherman.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 39F Lane 1116, House # 377	Residential Building. The house of Ahmed bin Yousif al-Bu'ainin, a <i>nukhidhah</i> of a pearling vessel.	Architectural and Historical Heritage
House 39G Lane 1138, House # 2063	Residential Building.	Architectural and Historical Heritage
House 39H House 1 - Lane 1122, House # 747; House 2 - Lane 1122	Heritage Building. This house used to be the majlis of Salman Bin Mattar (a famous <i>tawwash</i>). This was the small majlis for coffee preparation and entertaining employees.	Architectural and Historical Heritage
House 39I Lane 1122, House #s 754 and 756	Heritage Building. It was the big majlis of Salman Bin Mattar, where he entertained his guests. Later it belonged to Mohammad bin Salman Mattar.	Architectural and Historical Heritage

House 39J Lane 1135, House # 1876	Heritage Building. House belongs to the ruling family, owned by Sheikh Khalifa, the brother of Sheikh Salman bin Ali bin Khalifa Al-Khalifa who House no. 39B.	Architectural and Historical Heritage
House 39K Sheikh Abdulla Bin Isa Ave, House # 299	Heritage Building. Owned by Sheikh Abdullah bin Jassim Al-Thani of Qatar.	Architectural and Historical Heritage

House 39M Shaikh Abdulla Bin Isa Ave, House # 317 and a house at Lane 1135, # 1902	Residential Building. House owned by Yousif bin Khatir.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 39O Lane 1135, House # 1879	Residential Building. Hamad Isa Bu Alshouk inherited this property. He used to be cook for the Al Khalifa family and used to accompanying them on hunting trips.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 39P Lane 1136, House #s 1950, 1956 and 1960	Residential Building. This used to be the house of Yousif bin Khatir, a <i>tawwash</i> who travelled to India for pearl trading and property dealings.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 39S House 1 - Lane 1135, House # 1885; House 2 – Lane 1135, House # 1893	Residential Building. The used to be the house of Hassan al Fadhalah, a <i>tawwash barr</i> , a pearl trader.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 47B Lane 1123, House # 939	Residential Building. Owned by the Bin Butti family.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 47C Lane 1123, House # 935 and a house at Lane 1120, # 677	Residential Building. An amara of the Bin Khatir family. Originally a 2 storey building, the second floor collapsed in 2005 or 2006. Rice and food were sold in the corner of the building that was facing lane 1123.	Architectural and Historical Heritage

House 47D Shops at Road 1125, #s 1233, 1235, 1237, 1239	Shop It was part of a larger warehouse (amara) belonging to a carpenter named Ahmed Jaffar Um A'baad. This part of the warehouse was rented out. This building and the surrounding ones are part of family endowments.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 47E Shops at Road 1125, # 1251	Shop It was part of a larger amara belonging to a carpenter named Ahmed Jaffar Um A'baad. This part of the warehouse was rented out. This building and the adjoining ones are part of family endowments.	Architectural and Historical Heritage
House 47 G Shop at Road 1125, # 1271	Shop It used to be the amara of Yousif bin Khatir for wood and ship building materials for the pearling boats.	Architectural and Historical Heritage
House 47I Shops at Road 1125, #s 1283, 1293 and 1295	Residential Building In house # 1283 wooden doors used to be sold.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 48A Lane 1122, House #s 763 and 765 and a house at Lane 1120, #s 658 and 662	Heritage Building The whole block was the property of the Al Butti family. They were fishermen who worked on the pearling boats in the pearling season. They made fish-traps (the circular ones), maintained broken fish nets and also went fishing themselves. In the pearling season they worked as divers and haulers.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 48C Lane 1122, House #s 766, 768 and 772	Heritage Building This property belonged to the family of Saad al-Bu'ainim, he was a <i>nukhidhah</i> for Bin Mattar.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 48D Lane 1122, House #s 761	Heritage Building Originally a <i>barasti</i> , possibly the home of a <i>saib</i> .	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 48E Lane 1120, House #s 640	Heritage Building Used to be the home of a man who was on the crew of pearling boats in the pearling season. In the offseason he was a packer on cargo ships bound to Africa and India. He died in the "Year of the Sinking".	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 48F Lane 1120, House # 636	Heritage Building It used to be a barasti, many barasti were destroyed in the "Year of the Fire" c. 1924/25.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 48G Lane 1119, House # ?635	Heritage Building It was house of a <i>tawwash</i> (pearl merchant).	Ordinary Heritage Value

House 22H Wali Al Ahed Ave, numbers 163 and 163A	Shop	Architecturally Significant Heritage Value
House 23A Lane 910, House # 88	Residential Building House was owned by Ahmed Siyadi, who then sold it to Sheikha Mariam Al Khalifa. Her son, Isa bin Ali bin Abdullah currently owns the house. Before the house was built it was a lot used by the Buchir family of House 23B to store gypsum rock imported from Qatar.	Architecturally Significant Heritage Value
House 23B3 Lane 901, # 35	Residential Building	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 23D Lane 937, House # 805	Residential Building House of the Buchir family, owned by Ahmed Matar.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 23E Road 941, House # 834	Residential Building House of Abdulmun'im Ibrahim Ahmed Hasan Buchir. First floor of the house estimated to be 95 years old, the second floor (made of cinder block) is about 26 years old. The family worked as divers and dive attendants. The uncle of the current occupant broke his sternum carrying rock from the seabed. His father used to import gypsum rock from Qatar for stone masonry for buildings. This rock was stored on the site of house 23A.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 23F Road 941, House 828	Residential Building House of Jasim Abdulla Mubarak al-Muslimani. His father, Abdulla, used to live there and converted the house from barasti to masonry. Abdulla worked as a <i>saib</i> (diver attendant) and then a <i>ghais</i> (diver). Jasim's grandfather also lived there when it was a barasti and was a pearl diver and a tailor. House 23H Lane 936, House # 768	Residential Building This house belonged to Ibrahim Jamshir, a trader in gold and pearls.	Ordinary Heritage Value
House 23J Lane 936, House # 779	Multi-storey Residential Building. Bahrain's only 4 storey building of the Pearling Era, designated a National Monument in January 2010; Owned by the Ministry of Culture; requires minor conservation; a Pearl Museum is planned for this property. The earliest parts of this property were built as one of the earliest stone houses in Muharraq in 1850 by Ahmad bin Jassim Siyadi. In 1921 the guest rooms, which dominate the	Ordinary Heritage Value

	property today, were built. A conservation plan is being prepared for this property.	
House 23K Lane 936, House # 763	Designated a National Monument in January 2010; owned by the Siyadi family; requires minor conservation; built by Ahmed bin Isa Siyadi in the 1930s; general maintenance is to be provided by the inhabitants, the Ministry of Culture is responsible for maintaining the architectural fabric, providing any technical upgrades such as electrical cabling, water supply and discharge systems, providing fire-fighting equipment and inspecting the property regularly. House 31O Lane 914, no number	Siyadi Mosque Designated a National Monument in January 2010; Original structure built in 1865, completely rebuilt in 1910; donated to the community by Isa and Jassim bin Yousif Siyadi; the oldest preserved building in Muharraq and the first to be donated by a pearl merchant; Owned by a religious waqf, administered by the Ministry of Justice and Islamic Affairs, who will cooperate with the Ministry of Culture. House 30H Lane 920, House # 365	Designated a National Monument in January 201 Owned by the Ajaj family is currently rented to the Shaykh Ebrahim bin Mohammad Al Khalifa Centre for Culture and Research, which has offered to contribute to the restoration of Nukhidhah House. The Shaykh Ebrahim Centre will also manage and maintain the property on a daily basis. The Ministry of Culture is responsible for long-term maintenance of the historic fabric and will inspect the property regularly. This property was the majlis of the <i>nukhidhah</i> Jassim Ajaj.
